FACE COVERINGS	Iowa law prevents schools from requiring face coverings for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors. The CDC, however, recommends universal indoor masking in K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Therefore, mask wearing is still recommended for unvaccinated individuals; as it is one of the layered prevention strategies to keep our students healthy. Parents should determine what is best for their child(ren), and also discuss the importance of respecting the face-covering decisions of others.	HF847 CDC- FC IDPH
PHYSICAL DISTANCING	The CDC recommends schools maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students when possible. Spalding Catholic School will work to maintain 3 feet of distance within the school setting when possible.	CDC- PD
HAND WASHING	The CDC states handwashing is a proven prevention strategy and is one of many important layers of protection for students. Spalding Catholic School will utilize reminders and scheduling to promote consistent hand washing throughout the school day. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the school building.	CDC- HW
CLEANING AND DISINFECTING	The CDC states proper cleaning and disinfection are important layers of prevention to keep schools safe. Spalding Catholic School will continue cleaning and disinfecting efforts throughout the school day including increased cleaning of	CDC- C&D

COVID TRACKING & QUARANTINING IDPH advises exposed children and staff should not be required stay home, regardless of mask usage. When there is a positive case, parents should be given information around exposure to COVID-19 in order to make their own informed decisions regardless.	e <u>CDC- CT</u>

VIRTUAL LEARNING	Spalding Catholic School will offer alternative learning opportunities or a short-term virtual learning option for students needing to isolate or quarantine. When an illness or desire to quarantine is reported to school, your student's teacher will reach out about the best alternative for your student.	
TRANSPORTATION	Spalding Catholic School follows public school guidance for students using public school busing/transportation. Masks will be optional on MOC-FV buses and on Spalding Catholic School buses for the 2021-22 school year.
